

Izola May Williams

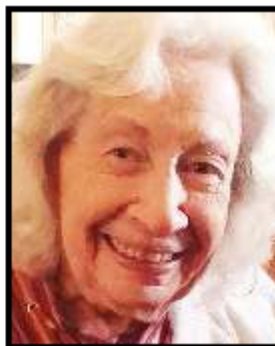
May 17, 1929 – December 30, 2020
